Victor Frankenstein was caught trying to leave the city of IgoIstad & is now under police guard awaiting trial.


A Press Conference is to be held between Victor Frankenstein & the residents of Igolstad. The following people will attend:

- Professor Waldman A supporter of scientific developments from the University where Victor Frankenstein trained.

The Press Conference is your chance to ask Victor Frankenstein all about what he had done & gain answers to any questions you have. Using the play for evidence gathering, prepare your part by making notes on your character & be ready to give a statement about what has happened to you & your role in the tragedy.

- 2. You have used the play to get ideas about what to say & what your character thinks.
- 3. You can listen to others & present your case clearly to other.
